I. Situation Overview

On 18 February 2023 at around 9:05 PM, a fire incident occurred in Brgy. Tatalon, Quezon City. The fire was declared out at around 12:41 AM.

1. Standby Funds

- ₱748.73 million Quick Response Fund (QRF) at the DSWD Central Office.
- ₱5 million available at DSWD FO NCR.

2. Prepositioned FFPs and Other Relief Items

- 146,483 FFPs available in Disaster Response Centers; of which, 84,536 FFPs are at the National Resource Operations Center (NROC), Pasay City and 61,947 FFPs are at the Visayas Disaster Resource Center (VDRC), Mandaue City.
- 8,369 FFPs available at DSWD FO NCR.
- ₱335.27 million worth of other FNIs at NROC, VDRC, and DSWD FO NCR warehouses.

b. Food and Non-food Items (FNIs)

19 February 2023	 The LGU of Quezon City through its Social Services and Development Department (SSDD) provided hot meals and other basic needs to the affected families. The LGU of Quezon City put up a community kitchen.

c. Camp Coordination and Camp Management (CCCM)
