2. Prepositioned FFPs and Other Relief Items

- 106,374 FFPs available in Disaster Response Centers; of which, 29,868 FFPs are at the National Resource Operations Center (NROC), Pasay City and 76,506 FFPs are at the Visayas Disaster Resource Center (VDRC), Mandaue City.
- 8,369 FFPs available at DSWD FO NCR.
- ₱338.19 million worth of other FNIs at NROC, VDRC, and DSWD FO NCR warehouses.


