

## DSWD DROMIC Report #1 on the Fire incident in Brgy. Apolonio Samson, Quezon City as of 02 February 2022, 6PM

### I. Situation Overview

On 01 February 2023 at around 2:06 PM, a fire incident occurred in Kaingin Bukid, Brgy. Apolonio Samson, Quezon City. The fire was declared out at around 6:22 PM.
