



DSWD DROMIC Report #1 on the Tension Cracks due to Impending Landslide in Barili, Cebu

as of 09 February 2023, 6PM

I. Situation Overview

On 11 January 2023, tension cracks were observed on the roads in Brgy. Maigang, Barili, Cebu. On 17 January 2023, the Local Disaster Risk and Reduction and Management Office (LDRRMO) in coordination with the Mines and Geosciences Bureau (MGB) inspected the site as well as areas in the nearby barangay.

On 03 February 2023 at 4:45 PM, the MGB released a Landslide Threat Advisory and further recommended preemptive evacuation of families residing in the affected areas. However, the residents refused to leave their house. Most of the families have eventually evacuated during the force evacuation conducted by the LGU of Barili, Cebu on 05 February 2023.

1. Standby Funds

- ₱758.09 million Quick Response Fund (QRF) at the DSWD Central Office.
- ₱5 million available at DSWD FO VII.

2. Prepositioned FFPs and Other Relief Items

- 145,516 FFPs available in Disaster Response Centers; of which, 54,748 FFPs are at the National Resource Operations Center (NROC), Pasay City and 90,768 FFPs are at the Visayas Disaster Resource Center (VDRC), Mandaue City.
- 37,034 FFPs available at DSWD FO VII.
- ₱378.06 million worth of other FNIs at NROC, VDRC, and DSWD FO VII warehouses.

b. Food and Non-food Items (FNIs)

08 February 2023	 DSWD FO VII through its Municipal Action Team (MAT) and the LGU of Barili, Cebu jointly distributed relief items such as FFPs, sleeping kits, and hygiene kits to the affected families.
05 February 2023	 The LGU of Barili, Cebu extended 3kg of rice and canned goods to the affected families staying in the evacuation center.
18 January 2023	 The LGU of Barili, Cebu distributed DSWD FFPs to the affected families.

c. Other Activities

DATE	ACTIVITIES
06 February 2023	• The Crisis Intervention Section (CIS) of DSWD FO VII conducted intake interview to all affected families and provided each family with ₱10,000.00 financial assistance in collaboration with the Office of Cebu 3 rd District Representative Pablo John F. Garcia.
05 February 2023	• The Municipal Action Team (MAT) of DSWD FO VII assisted the LGU of Barili, Cebu in the profiling of the affected families and continuously monitored the LGU activities in the area.
02 February 2023	• DSWD FO VII closely coordinated with the LGU of Barili, Cebu to continuously monitor the situation and needs of the affected families.





DATE	ACTIVITIES
18 January 2023	 Barili, Cebu Mayor Pablo John D. Garcia IV personally extended ₱1,000.00 financial assistance to each of the affected families.
17 January 2023	 The Local Social Welfare and Development Office (LSWDO) of the LGU of Barili, Cebu visited the affected area in coordination with the Barangay LGU to check the situation and needs of the families.
