I. Situation Overview

On 30 January 2023 at around 12:18 PM, a fire incident occurred in Brgy. 209, Manila City. The fire was declared out at around 1:48 PM.

1. Standby Funds

- ₱758.09 million Quick Response Fund (QRF) at the DSWD-Central Office.
- ₱5 million available at DSWD FO NCR.

2. Prepositioned FFPs and Other Relief Items

- 139,255 FFPs available in Disaster Response Centers; of which, 51,549 FFPs are at the National Resource Operations Center (NROC), Pasay City and 87,706 FFPs are at the Visayas Disaster Resource Center (VDRC), Mandaue City.
- 8,369 FFPs available at DSWD-FO NCR.
- ₱343.18 million worth of other FNIs at NROC, VDRC, and DSWD-FO warehouses countrywide.

30 January 2023	 The LGU of Manila City through its Manila Department of Social Welfare (MDSW) provided hot meals (breakfast, lunch, and dinner) and facilitated the provision of other relief goods and construction supplies to the affected families.
