

## DSWD DROMIC Report #2 on the Fire Incident in Brgy. 209, Manila City as of 08 February 2023, 6PM

### I. Situation Overview

On 30 January 2023 at around 12:18 PM, a fire incident occurred in Brgy. 209, Manila City. The fire was declared out at around 1:48 PM.
