I. Situation Overview

On 16 February 2023 at around 4:03 PM, a fire incident occurred at Remedios A. Lopez St., Brgy. Labangon, Cebu City. The fire was declared out at around 4:49 PM.

1. Standby Funds

Labangon served as camp personnel. They render duty at the evacuation center on rotating schedule.
16 February 2023	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • The LGU of Cebu City opened Bliss Elementary School which serves as the evacuation center for the families affected by the fire incident. • The LGU of Cebu City administered the profiling of the affected families through the use of Disaster Assistance Family Access Card (DAFAC).

17 February 2023	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • The LGU of Cebu City deployed its response team composed of the CDRRMO and Barangay Officials. • DSWD FO VII continuously monitored the status of the affected families in coordination with the DSWS of the LGU of Cebu City and for any request of relief augmentation and technical assistance on CCCM.
