

DSWD DROMIC Report #2 on the Fire Incident in Brgy. Mandaragat, Puerto Princesa City, Palawan

I. Situation Overview

On 31 January 2023 at 10:30 PM, a fire incident occurred in Brgy. Mandaragat, Puerto Princesa City, Palawan. The fire was declared out at around 12PM.
