I. Situation Overview

On 31 January 2023 at 10:30 PM, a fire incident occurred in Brgy. Mandaragat, Puerto Princesa City, Palawan. The fire was declared out at around 12PM.

V. Cost of Humanitarian Assistance Provided

c. Other Activities

02 February 2022	 The City Social Welfare and Development Office (CSWDO) of the LGU of Puerto Princesa City conducted a rapid assessment of the extent of damages to the affected families. DSWD FO MIMAROPA continuously coordinates with the CSWDO of the LGU of Puerto Princesa City for significant disaster response update and any request of relief augmentation.





DATE	ACTIVITIES
01 February 2022	 DSWD FO MIMAROPA through its Social Welfare and Development Office (SWADO) in Palawan immediately conducted intake interview and assessment of the affected families. The CSWDO of the LGU of Puerto Princesa City in coordination with the City Action Team, City Disaster Risk Reduction and Management Office (CDRRMO), Philippine National Police (PNP), Philippine Red Cross, and Barangay Council of Mandaragat conducted house visitation to further assess the situation of the affected families.

The Disaster Response Operations Monitoring and Information Center (DROMIC) of DSWD-DRMB is closely coordinating with DSWD FO MIMAROPA for significant disaster response updates and assistance provided.
