I. Situation Overview

On 01 February 2023 at around 2:06 PM, a fire incident occurred in Kaingin Bukid, Brgy. Apolonio Samson, Quezon City. The fire was declared out at around 6:22 PM.

1. Standby Funds

2. Prepositioned FFPs and Other Relief Items

- 113,469 FFPs available in Disaster Response Centers; of which, 28,963 FFPs are at the National Resource Operations Center (NROC), Pasay City and 84,506 FFPs are at the Visayas Disaster Resource Center (VDRC), Mandaue City.
- 8,369 FFPs available at DSWD FO NCR.
- ₱340.2 million worth of other FNIs at NROC, VDRC, and DSWD FO NCR warehouses.





b. Food and Non-food Items (FNIs)

01 February 2023	The Social Services Development Department (SSDD) of the LGU of Quezon City provided the affected families with hot meals, mats, blankets, and other basic needs. A community kitchen was also set up.
