

DSWD DROMIC Report #2 on the Fire incident in Sta. Cruz, Manila City as of 17 February 2023, 6PM

I. Situation Overview

On 15 February 2023 at around 4:40 PM, a fire incident occurred in Barangays 267 and 258 in Sta. Cruz, Manila City. The fire was declared out at around 7:41 PM.

A total of **160 families** or **583 persons** are affected in **two (2) barangays** in **Sta. Cruz, Manila City** (see Table 1).
