

DSWD DROMIC Report #2 on the Flooding Incident in Zamboanga City as of 04 February 2023, 6PM

I. Situation Overview

On 31 January 2023 at around 2PM, several barangays in Zamboanga City experienced flooding due to continuous heavy rains brought by localized thunderstorms.

A total of **1,463 families** or **7,247 persons** are affected in **12 barangays** in **Zamboanga City** (see Table 1).

III. Status of Displaced Population

a. Inside Evacuation Center

A total of **762 families** or **3,810 persons** took temporary shelter in **seven (7) evacuation centers** in **Zamboanga City** (see Table 2).
