



DSWD DROMIC Report #3 on the Effects of Trough of LPA

as of 17 February 2023, 6PM

I. Situation Overview

Issued on 17 February 2023 at 11AM, the Low Pressure Area (Ipa) was estimated based on all available data at 380 km East Southeast of Hinatuan, Surigao del Sur or 435 km East of Davao city (7.2°N, 129.6°E). The LPA is forecast to move generally west Northwestward towards the eastern portion of Visayas or Mindanao. The probability of this weather disturbance to develop into a tropical depression remains less likely.

Hazards affecting land areas in the next 24 hours, the Trough of the LPA will bring moderate to heavy rains over eastern Visayas, Dinagat Islands, Surigao del Norte, and Surigao del Sur. Meanwhile, light to moderate with at times heavy rains will be experienced over Central Visayas, Northern Mindanao, Bicol Region, Davao Oriental, and the rest of Caraga. Under these conditions, flooding and rain-induced landslides are possible, especially in areas that are highly or very highly susceptible to these hazards as identified in hazard maps and in areas with significant antecedent rainfall. 

1. Standby Funds
