I. Situation Overview

On 12 February 2023 at around 6:30 AM, a fire incident occurred in Brgy. Addition Hills, Mandaluyong City. The fire was declared out at around 9:41 AM.

2. Prepositioned FFPs and Other Relief Items

- 102,977 FFPs available in Disaster Response Centers; of which, 85,530 FFPs are at the National Resource Operations Center (NROC), Pasay City and 17,447 FFPs are at the Visayas Disaster Resource Center (VDRC), Mandaue City.


