### V. Cost of Humanitarian Assistance Provided

A total of \$\mathbb{P}909,439.00\$ worth of assistance was provided to the affected families; of which, \$\mathbb{P}267,699.00\$ from the DSWD, \$\mathbb{P}630,380.00\$ from the Local Government Unit (LGU) and \$\mathbb{P}11,360.00\$ from Non-Government Organizations (NGOs) (see Table 4).

#### 1. Standby Funds

- ₱758.09 million Quick Response Fund (QRF) at the DSWD Central Office.
- ₱5 million available at DSWD FO VII.

#### 2. Prepositioned FFPs and Other Relief Items

- 124,464 FFPs available in Disaster Response Centers; of which, 38,358 FFPs are at the National Resource Operations Center (NROC), Pasay City and 86,106 FFPs are at the Visayas Disaster Resource Center (VDRC), Mandaue City.
- 32,022 FFPs available at DSWD FO VII.
- ₱381.62 million worth of other FNIs at NROC, VDRC, and DSWD FO VII warehouses.


