I. Situation Overview

On 31 January 2023 at 10:30 PM, a fire incident occurred in Brgy. Mandaragat, Puerto Princesa City, Palawan. The fire was declared out at around 12PM.

01 February 2023	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • DSWD FO MIMAROPA through its Social Welfare and Development Office (SWADO) in Palawan immediately conducted intake interview and assessment of the affected families. • The CSWDO of the LGU of Puerto Princesa City in coordination with the City Action Team, City Disaster Risk Reduction and Management Office (CDRRMO), Philippine National Police (PNP), Philippine Red Cross, and Barangay Council of Mandaragat conducted house visitation to further assess the situation of the affected families.

The Disaster Response Operations Monitoring and Information Center (DROMIC) of DSWD-DRMB is closely coordinating with DSWD FO MIMAROPA for significant disaster response updates and assistance provided.
