

## DSWD DROMIC Report #3 on the Fire Incident in Molo, Iloilo City as of 02 February 2023, 6PM

### I. Situation Overview

On 28 January 2023 at around 4:37 AM, a fire incident occurred in Barangays West Habog-Habog and San Juan in Molo, Iloilo City. It was declared fire out at around 6:16 AM.

### c. Camp Coordination and Camp Management (CCCM)

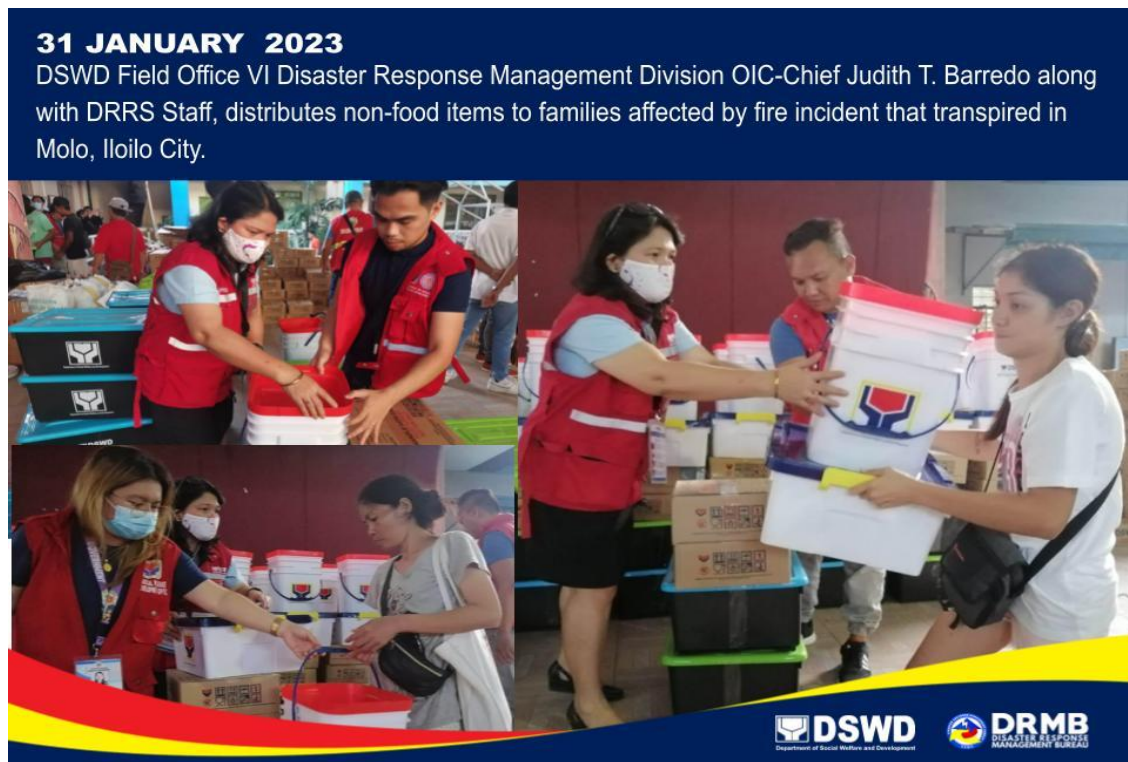
