as of 04 March 2023, 6PM

I. Situation Overview

On 15 February 2023 at around 4:40 PM, a fire incident occurred in Barangays 267 and 258 in Sta. Cruz, Manila City. The fire was declared out at around 7:41 PM.

A total of **160 families** or **583 persons** are affected in **two (2) barangays** in **Sta. Cruz, Manila City** (see Table 1).

16 February 2023	 The LGU of Manila City through its Manila Department of Social Welfare (MDSW) activated CCCM and other response clusters. The LGU of Manila City through its MDSW continuously conducted intake interviews, assessment, validation, and master listing of the affected families and individuals.
