



# DSWD DROMIC Report #3 on the Mw 6.0 Earthquake Incident in Compostela, Davao De Oro

as of 06 February 2023, 6PM

## I. Situation Overview

On 01 February 2023 at 6:44 PM, a 6.0-magnitude earthquake jolted the Municipality of Compostela, Davao De Oro (07.66°N, 126.07°E - 002 km S 66° W) with a tectonic origin and a depth of focus 017 km. The earthquake was also felt in the neighboring municipalities.

A total of **632 families** or **2,259 persons** are affected in **26 barangays** in **Davao de Oro** (see Table 1).
