

## DSWD DROMIC Report #38 on the Effects of Shear Line as of 11 February 2023, 6PM

### I. Situation Overview

On 26 December 2022, the Shear Line continuously affected Visayas and the northern portion of Mindanao while the Northeast Monsoon affected Luzon.

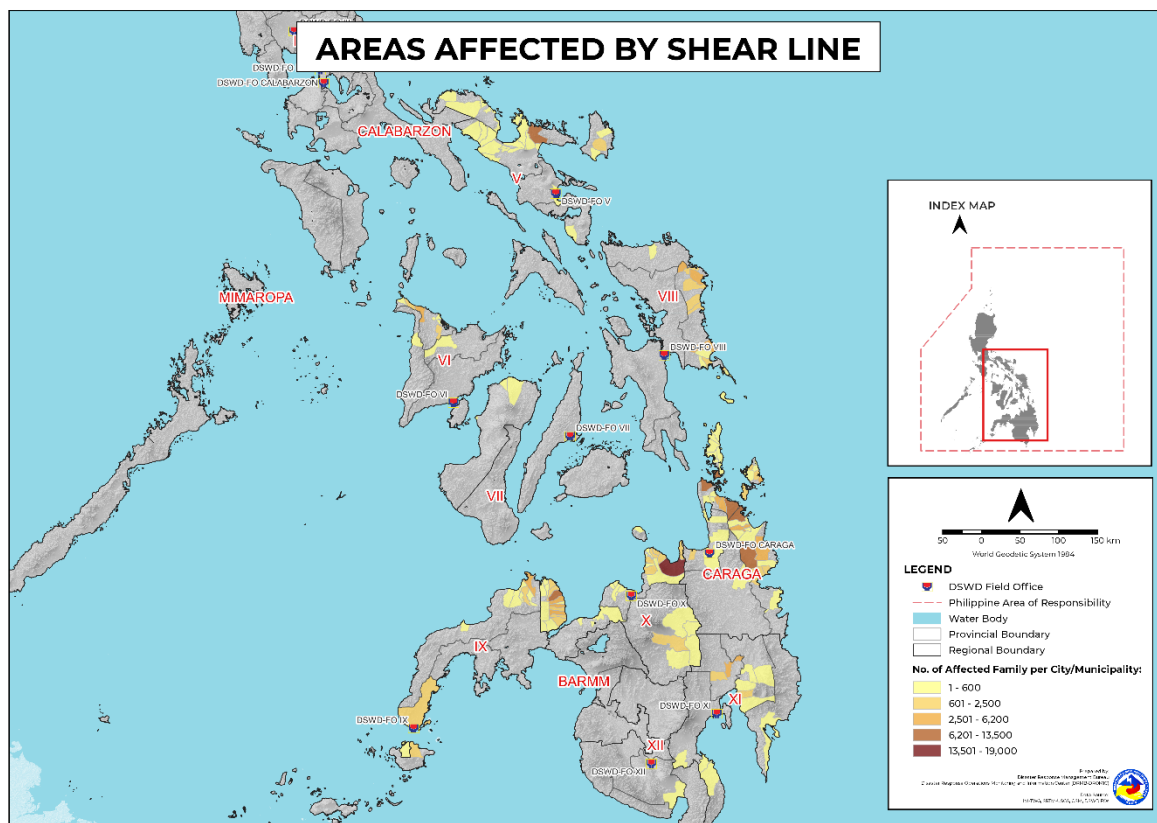
