I. Situation Overview

On 31 January 2023 at 10:30 PM, a fire incident occurred in Brgy. Mandaragat, Puerto Princesa City, Palawan. The fire was declared out at around 12PM.

1. Standby Funds

- 121,266 FFPs available in Disaster Response Centers; of which, 36,760 FFPs are at the National Resource Operations Center (NROC), Pasay City and 84,506 FFPs are at the Visayas Disaster Resource Center (VDRC), Mandaue City.

c. Other Activities

DATE	ACTIVITIES
02 February 2023	 The City Social Welfare and Development Office (CSWDO) of the LGU of Puerto Princesa City conducted a rapid assessment of the extent of damages to the affected families. DSWD FO MIMAROPA continuously coordinated with the CSWDO of the LGU of Puerto Princesa City for significant disaster response update and any request of relief augmentation. Private individuals in the said community have extended financial assistance to the affected families amounting to a total of ₱115,200.00.
01 February 2023	 DSWD FO MIMAROPA through its Social Welfare and Development Office (SWADO) in Palawan immediately conducted intake interview and assessment of the affected families. The CSWDO of the LGU of Puerto Princesa City in coordination with the City Action Team (CAT), City Disaster Risk Reduction and Management Office (CDRRMO), Philippine National Police (PNP), Philippine Red Cross, and Barangay Council of Mandaragat conducted house visitation to further assess the situation of the affected families.
