

DSWD DROMIC Report #5 on the Effects of LPA

as of 19 February 2023, 6PM

I. Situation Overview

Issued on 19 February 2023 at 11AM, the Low Pressure Area (LPA) was estimated based on all available data in the vicinity of San Vicente, Northern Samar or 40 KM East of Masbate City, Masbate (12.4°n, 124.0°e). The probability of this weather disturbance remains less likely to develop into a Tropical Depression within 24 hours.

Hazards affecting land areas in the next 24 hours, The LPA will bring moderate to heavy with at times intense rains over Cagayan, Isabela, Aurora, Quezon, Bicol Region, Eastern Samar, Northern Samar, and Samar. Meanwhile, light to moderate with at times heavy rains will be experienced over Metro Manila, the rest of Cagayan Valley, Cordillera Administrative Region, and CALABARZON, Nueva Ecija, Bulacan, Oriental Mindoro, Occidental Mindoro, Marinduque, Romblon, Northern Portion of Palawan, Aklan, Capiz, Antique, Iloilo, and Guimaras. Under these conditions, flooding and rain-induced landslides are likely, especially in areas that are highly or very highly susceptible to these hazards as identified in hazard maps and in areas with significant antecedent rainfall.

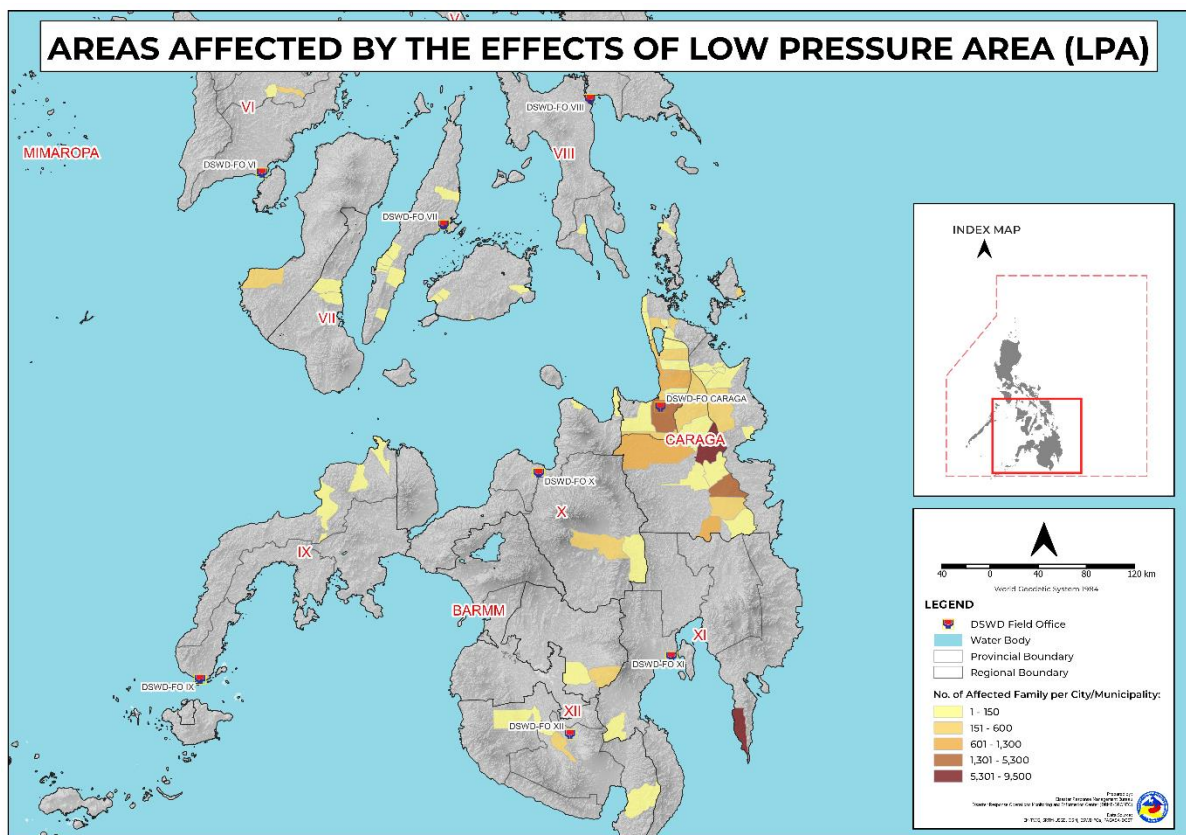
