



DSWD DROMIC Report #6 on the Flooding Incident in Davao Region

as of 06 March 2023, 6PM

I. Situation Overview

On 21 February 2023 at around 9 PM, residents from low-lying areas in several Municipalities in Davao Region experienced flooding due to localized thunderstorms.

1. Standby Funds

- ₱704.46 million Quick Response Fund (QRF) at the DSWD Central Office.
- ₱5 million available at DSWD FO XI.

2. Prepositioned FFPs and Other Relief Items

- 121,471 FFPs available in Disaster Response Centers; of which, 67,324 FFPs are at the National Resource Operations Center (NROC), Pasay City and 54,147 FFPs are at the Visayas Disaster Resource Center (VDRC), Mandaue City.
- 19,327 FFPs available at DSWD FO XI.
- ₱363.1 million worth of other FNIs at NROC, VDRC, and DSWD FO XI warehouses.

b. Food and Non-food Items (FNIs)

28 February 2023	DSWD FO XI assisted in the distribution of FFPs to the affected families in Brgys. San Vicente, San Antonio, Alegria, and Baybay.
27 February 2023	DSWD Secretary Rex Gatchalian, together with DSWD FO XI, led the distribution of FFPs to the displaced families in an evacuation center in Carmen, Davao del Norte.
22 February 2023	 DSWD FO XI provided FNIs such as FFPs, hygiene kits, sleeping kits, and additional modular tents to the affected families. The LGU of Davao City provided FNIs to displaced families and individuals.


