



# **DSWD DROMIC Report #7 on the Effects of LPA**

as of 21 February 2023, 6PM

# I. Situation Overview

Issued on 21 February 2023 at 11AM, the Low Pressure Area (LPA) was estimated based on all available data at 385 km East Northeast of Tuguegarao City, Cagayan or 390 km East of Aparri, Cagayan (18.4°N, 125.3°E). This weather disturbance is less likely to develop into a tropical depression.

The LPA will no longer be affecting the eastern section of Luzon as it continues to move generally northeastward. However due to the effects of the Northeast Monsoon, cloudy skies with rains will still be experienced over Cagayan Valley, Aurora, and Quezon.


