I. Situation Overview

On 31 January 2023 at 10:30 PM, a fire incident occurred in Brgy. Mandaragat, Puerto Princesa City, Palawan. The fire was declared out at around 12PM.

A total of **83 families** or **301 persons** were affected in **Brgy. Mandaragat, Puerto Princesa City** (see Table 1).

a. Inside Evacuation Center

A total of **10 families** or **60 persons** currently taking temporary shelter in **two (2) evacuation centers** in **Brgy. Mandaragat, Puerto Princesa City** (see Table 2).

V. Cost of Humanitarian Assistance Provided

A total of **₱802,602.50** worth of assistance was provided to the affected families; of which, **₱164,202.50** from the **DSWD**, **₱523,200.00** from the **Local Government Unit (LGU)**, and **₱115,200.00** from the **Non-Governmental Organizations (NGOs)** (see Table 6).
