

DSWD DROMIC Report #1 on the Effects of Northeast Monsoon in CAR

as of 07 March 2023, 6PM

I. Situation Overview

On 25 February 2023, the province of Apayao in the Cordillera Administrative Region (CAR) experienced cloudy skies with rains that brought possible flash floods or landslides due to moderate with at times heavy rains caused by the Northeast Monsoon.

A total of **3,498 families** or **13,480 persons** are affected in **16 barangays** in the province of **Apayao** (see Table 1).
