

## DSWD DROMIC Report #1 on the Effects of Shear Line in Eastern Visayas

as of 04 March 2022, 6PM

### I. Situation Overview

On 01 March 2023, several municipalities in Eastern Visayas experienced flooding due to heavy rains brought by the Effects of Shear Line in the region.
