

DSWD DROMIC Report #1 on the Fire Incident in Brgy. Addition Hills, Mandaluyong City as of 11 March 2023, 6PM

I. Situation Overview

On 11 March 2023 at around 7:15 AM, a fire incident occurred in Blk. 37, Brgy. Addition Hills, Mandaluyong City. The fire was declared out at around 8:37 AM.

2. Prepositioned FFPs and Other Relief Items

- 89,151 FFPs available in Disaster Response Centers; of which, 24,704 FFPs are at the National Resource Operations Center (NROC), Pasay City and 64,447 FFPs are at the Visayas Disaster Resource Center (VDRC), Mandaue City.
- 6,889 FFPs available at DSWD FO NCR.
- ₱357.18 million worth of other FNIs at NROC, VDRC, and DSWD FO NCR warehouses.
