I. Situation Overview

On 11 March 2023 at around 7:15 AM, a fire incident occurred in Blk. 37, Brgy. Addition Hills, Mandaluyong City. The fire was declared out at around 8:37 AM.

- 89,151 FFPs available in Disaster Response Centers; of which, 24,704 FFPs are at the National Resource Operations Center (NROC), Pasay City and 64,447 FFPs are at the Visayas Disaster Resource Center (VDRC), Mandaue City.
- 6,889 FFPs available at DSWD FO NCR.
- ₱357.18 million worth of other FNIs at NROC, VDRC, and DSWD FO NCR warehouses.

b. Food and Non-food Items (FNIs)

11 March 2023	 DSWD FO NCR facilitates the provision of FNIs (Family Food Packs, Sleeping Kits, and Hygiene Kits) to the families affected by the fire incident. The LGU of Mandaluyong City through its City Social Welfare and Development Department (CSWDD) provided hot meals, modular tents, and other basic needs to the affected families. Also, the same office facilitated the distribution of various donations to the affected families.

11 March 2023	 The LGU of Mandaluyong City through its CSWDD conducted intake interviews, assessment, validation, and master listing of the displaced families and individuals.

11 March 2023	 DSWD FO NCR ensured the availability of FNIs for possible additional relief augmentation to the LGU of Mandaluyong City. DSWD FO NCR continuously coordinated with the LGU of Mandaluyong City through its CSWDD for significant updates and any request of relief augmentation.
