



DSWD DROMIC Report #1 on the Fire Incident at Kayang Street, Baguio City

as of 12 March 2023, 6PM

I. Situation Overview

On 11 March 2023 at around 11:30 PM, a fire incident occurred at Blocks 3 and 4 of Baguio City Public Market along Kayang Street, Baguio City affecting numerous vendors in the area. The fire was declared out on 12 March 2023 at 4:38 AM.

II. Status of Affected Areas and Population

A total of 2,200 families or 2,200 persons were affected at the Baguio City Public Market, Kayang St., Baguio City (see Table 1).

1. Standby Funds

2. Prepositioned FFPs and Other Relief Items

- 85,849 FFPs available in Disaster Response Centers; of which, 21,402 FFPs are at the National Resource Operations Center (NROC), Pasay City and 64,447 FFPs are at the Visayas Disaster Resource Center (VDRC), Mandaue City.
- 40,660 FFPs available at DSWD FO CAR.
- ₱394.48 million worth of other FNIs at NROC, VDRC, and DSWD FO CAR warehouses.

12 March 2023	 DSWD FO CAR provided FFPs and laminated sacks to individuals affected by the fire incident. DSWD FO CAR ensure availability of food and non-food resources at the DSWD CAR Regional and Satellite warehouses.

c. Other Activities

 DSWD FO CAR continuously coordinates with the City Disaster Risk Reduction and Management Office (CDRRMO) of the Baguio City for significant updates and any request of relief augmentation. DSWD FO CAR activated its Disaster Response Management Division (DRMD) Quick Response Team (QRT) to monitor the incident and established the Emergency Operations Center (EOC). DSWD FO CAR Regional Director Leo Quintilla attended the post emergency meeting at the Rillera Building, Public Market, Baguio City. DSWD FO CAR staff conducted an assessment of the affected vendors. DSWD FO CAR together with CAR Regional Disaster Risk Reduction and Management Council (CRDRRMC) conducted immediately response to the needs of the LGU.
