

DSWD DROMIC Report #1 on the Flooding Incident in Davao de Oro

as of 15 March 2023, 6PM

I. Situation Overview

On 13 March 2023 at 4PM, cloudy skies with scattered rainshowers and thunderstorms due to the Low Pressure Area at 530 km East Southeast of Hinatuan, Surigao del Sur (6.6°N, 130.8°E) may have brought possible flash floods or landslides due to moderate with at times heavy rain in Caraga and Davao Region.

On 14 March 2023 at around 3AM, several municipalities in Davao de Oro experienced flooding due to heavy rains caused by the LPA.

A total of **856 families** or **4,050 persons** are affected in **ten (10) barangays** in **Davao de Oro** (see Table 1).
