

DSWD DROMIC Report #2 on the Fire Incident at Kayang Street, Baguio City as of 14 March 2023, 6PM

I. Situation Overview

On 11 March 2023 at around 11:30 PM, a fire incident occurred at Blocks 3 and 4 of Baguio City Public Market along Kayang Street, Baguio City affecting numerous vendors in the area. The fire was declared out on 12 March 2023 at 4:38 AM.

II. Status of Affected Areas and Population

A total of **2,200 families** or **2,200 persons** were affected at the **Baguio City Public Market, Kayang St., Baguio City** (see Table 1).

- ₱392.05 million worth of other FNIs at NROC, VDRC, and DSWD FO CAR warehouses.

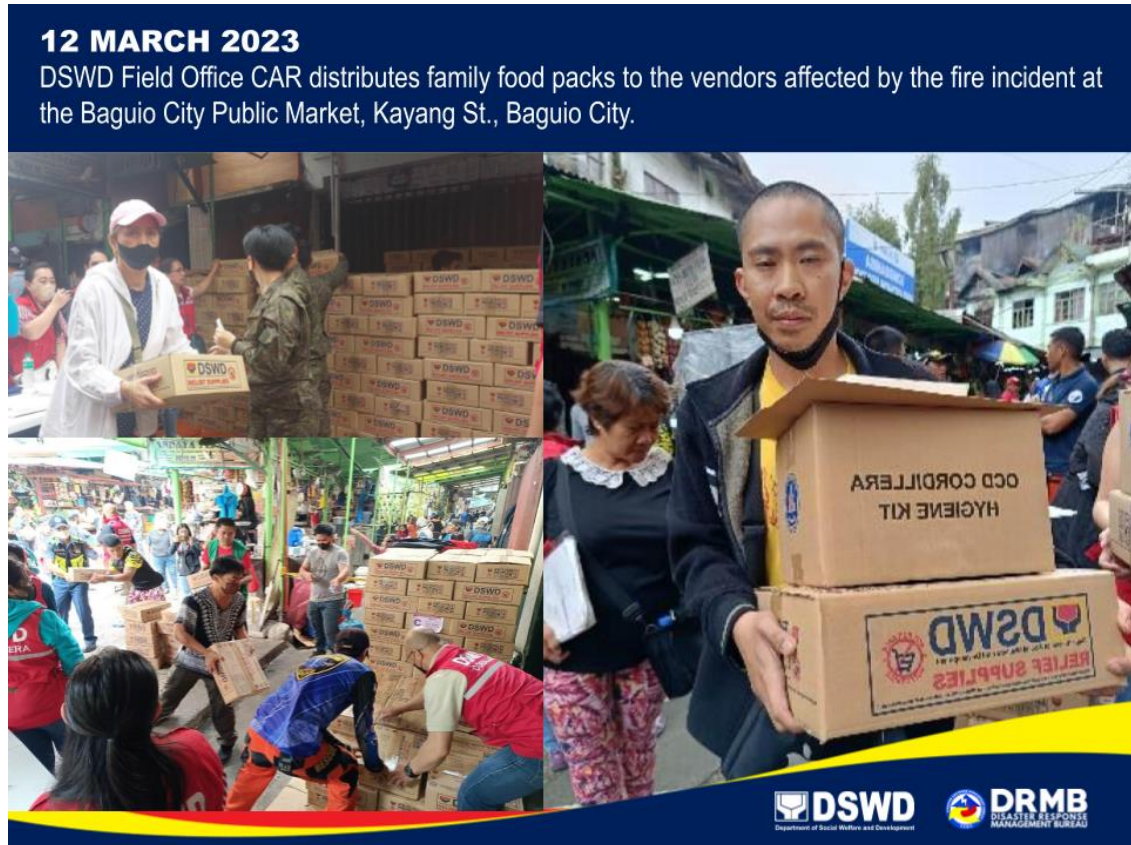
