

DSWD DROMIC Report #2 on the Fire Incident in Brgy. South Poblacion, Maramag, Bukidnon as of 30 March 2023, 6PM

I. Situation Overview

On 25 March 2023 at around 7:23 AM, a fire incident occurred at Purok 2, Brgy. South Poblacion, Maramag, Bukidnon. The fire was declared out at around 8:11 AM.
