I. Situation Overview

On 03 March 2023 at around 8PM, a fire incident occurred at Kawayanan St., Brgy. Additional Hills, Mandaluyong City. The fire was declared out at around 9:29 PM.

Also, the same office facilitated the distribution of various donations to the affected families.
