I. Situation Overview

On 11 March 2023 at around 7:15 AM, a fire incident occurred in Blk. 37, Brgy. Addition Hills, Mandaluyong City. The fire was declared out at around 8:37 AM.

2. Prepositioned FFPs and Other Relief Items

- 100,340 FFPs available in Disaster Response Centers; of which, 19,403 FFPs are at the National Resource Operations Center (NROC), Pasay City and 80,937 FFPs are at the Visayas Disaster Resource Center (VDRC), Mandaue City.
- 6,889 FFPs available at DSWD FO NCR.

- ₱354.75 million worth of other FNIs at NROC, VDRC, and DSWD FO NCR warehouses.

11 March 2023	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • The LGU of Mandaluyong City through its City Social Welfare and Development Department (CSWDD) provided hot meals, modular tents, and other basic needs to the affected families. Also, the same office facilitated the distribution of various donations to the affected families.
