I. Situation Overview

On 06 March 2023 at around 12:18 PM, a fire incident occurred at 199 Calamba St., Brgy. Talayan, Quezon City. The fire was declared out at around 2:01 PM.

- 89,151 FFPs available in Disaster Response Centers; of which, 24,704 FFPs are at the National Resource Operations Center (NROC), Pasay City and 64,447 FFPs are at the Visayas Disaster Resource Center (VDRC), Mandaue City.
- 6,889 FFPs available at DSWD FO NCR.
- ₱357.18 million worth of other FNIs at NROC, VDRC, and DSWD FO NCR warehouses.
