

# DSWD DROMIC Terminal Report on the Armed Conflict in Moises Padilla and Isabela, Negros Occidental

28 November 2023, 6PM

## I. Situation Overview

On 20 May 2023 at around 5:00 AM, an armed conflict transpired at the boundaries of Brgy. Quintin Remo, Moises Padilla and Brgy. Sebacauan, Isabela, Negros Occidental between the Government Troops (Philippine Army) and the members of the New People's Army (NPA).

A total of **308 families** or **1,177 persons** sought temporary shelter in **four (4) evacuation centers** in **Negros Occidental** (see Table 2).
