

## **DSWD DROMIC Preparedness for Response Report #3 on the Observance of Semana Santa 2023**

as of 08 April 2023, 6PM

### **Situation Overview**

As the Asian country with the highest population of Christianity, the Philippines commemorates the yearly week-long celebration of Jesus Christ's sacrifice on the cross for the salvation of His people from sin and His gift of everlasting life. The "Semana Santa" or Holy Week starts on Palm Sunday and ends on Easter Sunday – the day where we celebrate Christ's resurrection from the dead. The whole week is observed in solemnity, with Holy Thursday and Good Friday recognized as official holidays by the state. As such, it is common that Filipinos begin to take leave from school or work as early as Holy Monday and lasting the entire week.

During this time, majority of Filipinos join the rush to go home to their respective hometowns and provinces to spend this holy festivity together with their families. Consequently, an increase in volume of people are expected in transport stations such as bus terminals, air and sea ports, which amplifies the vulnerability of these people to human-induced disasters. Naturally, we also cannot rule out the possibility of the occurrence of natural disasters during this period.

### **Weather Bulletin**

Issued at 08 April 2023 at 4PM, the Northeasterly Surface Windflow affects Northern and Central Luzon.

Cagayan Valley and the Cordillera Administrative Region might experience cloudy skies with rains brought by the Northeasterly Surface Windflow. Central Luzon and the rest of Northern Luzon might experience partly cloudy to cloudy skies with light rains also due to the Northeasterly Surface Windflow.

Eastern Visayas, Sorsogon, Masbate, Surigao del Norte, and Dinagat Islands might experience cloudy skies with scattered rainshowers and thunderstorms due to the Trough of Low Pressure Area.

Metro Manila and the rest of the country might experience partly cloudy to cloudy skies with isolated rainshowers or thunderstorms brought by either the Trough of LPA or Localized Thunderstorms.

## Status of Prepositioned Resources: Stockpile and Standby Funds

The DSWD Central Office (CO), Field Offices (FOs), and National Resource Operations Center (NROC) have stockpiles and standby funds amounting to **₱1,431,654,480.10** with breakdown as follows (see Table 2):

### a. Standby Funds

A total of **₱117,028,673.06** standby funds in the CO and FOs. Of the said amount, **₱46,808,755.23** is the available **Quick Response Fund (QRF)** in the CO.

### b. Stockpiles

A total of **692,450 family food packs (FFPs)** amounting to **₱489,765,252.00**, **other food items** amounting to **₱187,929,896.53**, and **non-food items (FNIs)** amounting to **₱636,930,658.51** are available.
