Situation Overview

On 06 April 2023 at around 3:45 PM, an armed conflict transpired between the troops of the Philippine Army and members of the New People's Army at Sitio Seraje, Brgy. San Isidro, Toboso, Negros Occidental.

2. Prepositioned FFPs and Other Relief Items

70,140 FFPs available in Disaster Response Centers; of which, 35,293 FFPs are at the National Resource Operations Center (NROC), Pasay City and 34,847 FFPs are at the Visayas Disaster Resource Center (VDRC), Mandaue City.
