

DSWD DROMIC Report #1 on the Effects of Localized Thunderstorms in Brgy. Lumbangan, Mabinay, Negros Oriental

as of 22 April 2023, 6PM

I. Situation Overview

On 21 April 2023, partly cloudy to cloudy skies with isolated rainshowers or thunderstorms due to Easterlies or Localized Thunderstorms may have caused possible flash floods or landslides during severe thunderstorms in Metro Manila and the rest of the country.

At 12:30 PM, severe thunderstorms due to localized thunderstorms brought hail, heavy rains and strong winds in Brgy. Lumbangan and on other parts of Mabinay, Negros Oriental.
