I. Situation Overview

On 07 April 2023 at around 12:20 PM, a fire incident occurred at G. Araneta Ave. Brgy. Tatalon, Quezon City. The fire was declared out at around 3:03 PM.

- ₱5 million available at DSWD FO NCR.

2. Prepositioned FFPs and Other Relief Items

- 70,140 FFPs available in Disaster Response Centers; of which, 35,293 FFPs are at the National Resource Operations Center (NROC), Pasay City and 34,847 FFPs are at the Visayas Disaster Resource Center (VDRC), Mandaue City.
- 28,844 FFPs available at DSWD FO NCR.
- ₱273.4 million worth of other FNIs at NROC, VDRC, and DSWD FO NCR warehouses.
