I. Situation Overview

On 18 April 2023 at around 1:28 AM, a fire incident occurred in Calbayog City, Samar. The fire broke out in Brgy. Carmen and hit parts of Brgy. Obrero which is an adjacent barangay.

A total of **215 families** or **966 persons** are affected in **two (2) barangays** in **Calbayog City, Samar** (see Table 1).

DSWD FO VIII continuously coordinates with concerned offices for significant disaster updates and facilitation of augmentation requests.
