



# DSWD DROMIC Report #1 on the Hand, Foot and Mouth Disease (HFMD) Outbreak in Barotac Nuevo, Iloilo

as of 04 April 2023, 6PM

#### I. Situation Overview

Hand, foot and mouth disease (HFMD) is a common infectious disease that occurs most often in children, but can also occur in adolescents and occasionally in adults. In most cases, the disease is mild and self-limiting, with common symptoms including fever, painful sores in the mouth, and a rash with blisters on hands, feet and buttocks. However, more severe symptoms such as meningitis, encephalitis, and polio-like paralysis may occur.

In February 2023, the Iloilo Provincial Health Office (IPHO) confirmed an outbreak of HFMD. Relative to this, the LGU of Barotac Nuevo requested for augmentation in response to the increasing cases of HFMD.

# II. Status of Affected Areas and Population

A total of **260 families** or **275 persons** are affected in **29 barangays** in **Barotac Nuevo**, **Iloilo** (see Table 1).


