Situation Overview

On 06 April 2023 at around 3:45 PM, an armed conflict transpired between the troops of the Philippine Army and members of the New People's Army at Sitio Seraje, Brgy. San Isidro, Toboso, Negros Occidental.

2. Prepositioned FFPs and Other Relief Items

- 36,289 FFPs available in Disaster Response Centers; of which, 15,761 FFPs are at the National Resource Operations Center (NROC), Pasay City and 20,528 FFPs are at the Visayas Disaster Resource Center (VDRC), Mandaue City.
- 82,518 FFPs available at DSWD FO VI.
- ₱272.02 million worth of other FNIs at NROC, VDRC, and DSWD FO VI warehouses.
