I. Situation Overview

On 26 April 2023 at around 10:35 AM, a fire incident occurred at Purok Kilowang, Brgy. Luz Banzon, Jasaan, Misamis Oriental. The fire was declared out 11:45 AM.

III. Status of Displaced Population

a. Inside Evacuation Center

There are three (3) families or 15 persons currently taking temporary shelter at the Public Market in Brgy. Luz Banzon, Jasaan, Misamis Oriental (see Table 2).

1. Standby Funds
