

DSWD DROMIC Report #3 on Tropical Depression “Amang” as of 13 April 2023, 6PM

I. Situation Overview

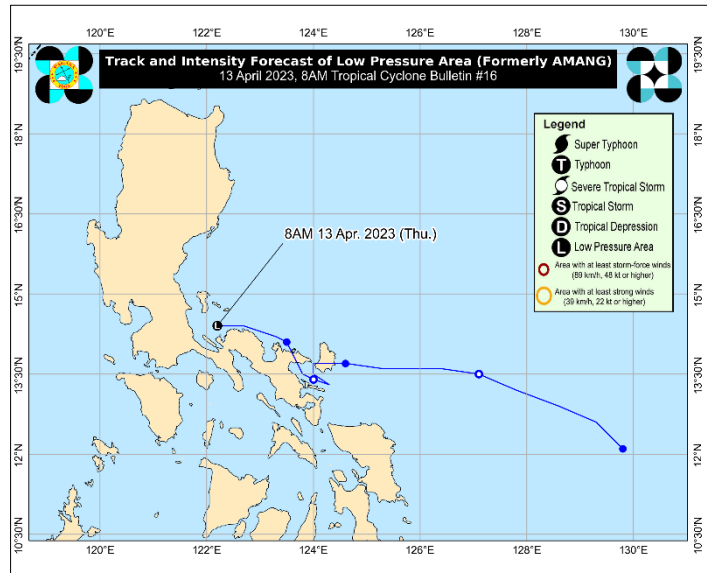
Issued on 13 April 2023 at 11AM, “Amang” weakens into a remnant low.

Hazards affecting Land Areas

Heavy Rainfall Outlook:

Forecast accumulated rainfall for the next 24 hours (from this morning to tomorrow morning)

- Up to 25 mm in most areas of Central Luzon, Metro Manila, and CALABARZON, reaching 50 mm in a few locations (mostly in Aurora and Quezon) caused by scattered rainshowers and thunderstorms



Under these conditions, isolated flashfloods and rain-induced landslides remains possible, especially in areas that are highly or very highly susceptible to these hazards as identified in hazard maps and in localities that experienced considerable amounts of rainfall for the past several days. For more information, refer to Weather Advisory #1 for Low Pressure area issued on 13 April 2023 at 11AM.

Hazards affecting Coastal Waters

- The remnant low is unlikely to bring rough seas over the coastal waters of the country which may result to risky conditions to mariners.

Track and Intensity Outlook

- “Amang” weakened into a low pressure area (LPA) at 8AM today. The remnant circulation of “Amang” is forecast to track generally northward or west northward towards Polillo Islands and northern mainland Quezon. This weather disturbance may dissipate in the next 24 hours.

The LPA (formerly “Amang”) was estimated based on all available data over the coastal waters of Polillo, Quezon (14.4°N, 122.0°E) moving west northward at 10 km/h.

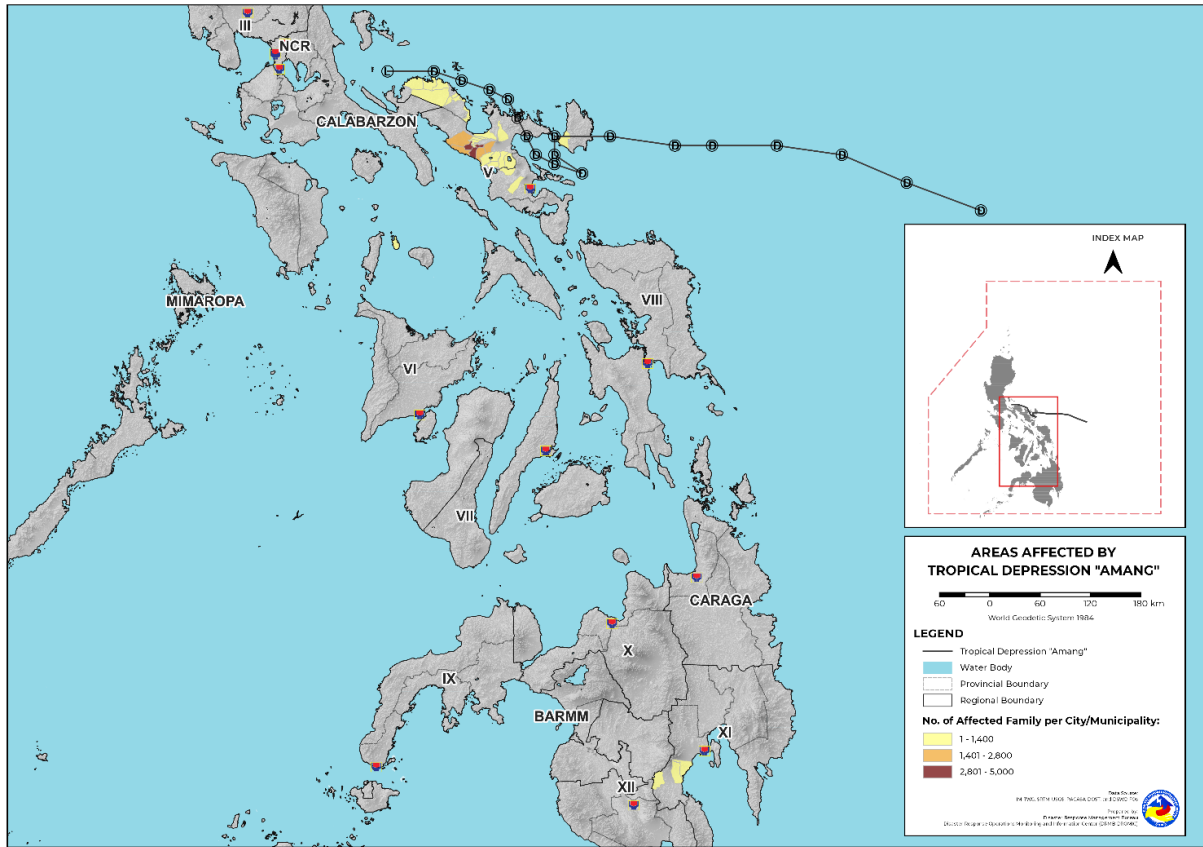
