

DSWD DROMIC Report #4 on the Fire Incident in Brgy. Poblacion, Bontoc, Mountain Province

as of 23 April 2023, 6PM

I. Situation Overview

On 11 April 2023 at around 2AM, a fire incident occurred at Sitio Loc-ong, Brgy. Poblacion, Bontoc, Mountain Province. The fire was declared out at around 7:20 AM.

There are **60 families** or **136 persons** who sought temporary shelter at **All Saints Mission Open Gym** in **Brgy. Poblacion, Bontoc, Mountain Province** (see Table 2).
