

DSWD DROMIC Report #5 on Tropical Depression “Amang” as of 15 April 2023, 6PM

I. Situation Overview

On 09 April 2023, partly cloudy to cloudy skies with isolated rainshowers or thunderstorms due to the trough of the Low Pressure Area (LPA) caused flashfloods in several municipalities in Davao del Sur.

On 10 April 2023, the said LPA was estimated based on all available data at 905 km East of Mindanao (9.5°N, 134.5°E).

On 11 April 2023 at 4AM, the LPA east of Catanduanes developed into Tropical Depression (TD) “Amang”. At 10PM, “Amang” slightly weakened and made landfall in the vicinity of Panganiban, Catanduanes.

On 13 April 2023, “Amang” weakened into a Remnant Low.

A total of **37,504 families** or **135,061 persons** are affected in **233 barangays** in **Regions MIMAROPA, V, and XI** (see Table 1).


