

DSWD DROMIC Report #1 on the Armed Conflict in Brgy. Tabuan, Antequera, Bohol as of 13 May 2023, 6PM

I. Situation Overview

On 12 May 2023 at around 6:00AM, an armed conflict transpired between the special forces of the Philippine Army and members of the New People's Army.
