

DSWD DROMIC Report #1 on the Armed Conflict in Moises Padilla and Isabela, Negros Occidental

as of 20 May, 6PM

I. Situation Overview

On 20 May 2023 at around 5:00 AM, an armed conflict transpired at the boundaries of Brgy. Quintin Remo, Moises Padilla and Brgy. Sebacauan, Isabela, Negros Occidental between the Government Troops (Philippine Army) and the members of the New People's Army (NPA).

- ₱878.99 million Quick Response Fund (QRF) at the DSWD Central Office.

2. Prepositioned FFPs and Other Relief Items

- 110,667 FFPs available in Disaster Response Centers; of which, 101,525 FFPs are at the National Resource Operations Center (NROC), Pasay City and 9,142 FFPs are at the Visayas Disaster Resource Center (VDRC), Mandaue City.
- 73,209 FFPs available at DSWD FO VI.
- ₱244.17 million worth of other FNIs at NROC, VDRC and DSWD FO VI warehouses.
